

In addition to culture, sustainability is important to the city, “Sustainable tourism is a key tenet. In recent years, we started a “Respect the City” initiative that limits the number of visitors at any given time in order to strike a healthy balance and the project has been remarkably successful. Additionally, Dubrovnik has its own long history of self-sustainability due to its geographical location on the edge of the world. Our region was not heavily industrialized so we have largely preserved its natural beauty; including clean air, water, and picturesque villages,” says Dubrovnik Tourist Board Director, Miro Drašković.

In addition to tourism, the city is open to investment. The Mayor of Dubrovnik, Mato Franković adds, “I want to position Dubrovnik as a destination for digital nomads with good connectivity and a relaxed lifestyle. We are currently investing in the IT and film sectors and also seeking additional investment from neighboring countries like Switzerland, Austria and Germany. This coupled with the new Pelješac bridge makes Dubrovnik easily reachable and an attractive location for growth. ●

The city is lovely year-round, but for those who can visit in the fall, spring and winter, the streets are less crowded, the weather is more agreeable, and there are an increasing number of cultural and musical festivals that make the most of Dubrovnik’s magical atmosphere.

DUBROVNIK’S EURO ADOPTION & BALANCING TOURISM

How has Croatia’s adoption of the Euro impacted Dubrovnik’s economy?

The switch will benefit the city’s status as a top cruise port, as European travelers can pay in their own currency. For local businesses, the switch eliminates confusion for foreign visitors and makes it easier to serve their customers. Overall, the adoption of the Euro is a significant achievement for Croatia’s economic growth and integration into the EU.

Can you tell me more about the impact of the decrease of locals living in the old center of Dubrovnik due to tourism?

As Dubrovnik’s Mayor, I have realized that many cities around the world face similar challenges in their touristic areas. To reduce the negative impact of tourism on residents, we have initiated a management plan for our historic city and received UNESCO’s approval. We are taking steps to address noise issues, balancing the needs of visitors and residents. In 2017, we controlled the number

of cruise ships and visitors, resulting in a better distribution of tourists throughout the year. We continue to manage tourism with success; however, our job is never done as we strive to improve.

What incentives do you give to attract investors from Germany, Austria and Switzerland?

I want to position Dubrovnik as a destination for digital nomads with good connectivity and a relaxed lifestyle. We are investing in the IT and film sectors and seeking investment from neighboring countries like Austria and Germany. With the new Pelješac Bridge, Dubrovnik is easily reachable, making it an attractive location for growth.

How might a predicted recession for 2023 affect your projected growth of the city’s GDP?

In 2023, the cost of living has increased in many countries, making it harder for tourists to spend as they used to. Tourists will be more calculated with their spending, and as a tourist destination, we must adjust prices, services, and quality of service to stand out. To fight for quality, we launched the project “Respect the City” to increase the length of stay of tourists and change the perception of Dubrovnik as a one-day destination. Dubrovnik has the advantage of being a hub with many interesting destinations in the surrounding area, and we must take advantage of this to attract tourists.

Any final message?

Just a quote from George Bernard Shaw, when he came in Dubrovnik he wrote, “Those who seek paradise on earth should come and see Dubrovnik.” ●

DUBROVNIK-NERETVA COUNTY: UNLOCKING INVESTMENT & TOURISM POTENTIAL

How will the adoption of the Euro impact the regional economy?

We are delighted that Croatia is taking steps towards European integration by joining the Schengen area and adopting the Euro. It will surely simplify payment transactions for tourists and increase our relevancy to European markets. We anticipate resoundingly positive impacts in the short and long term, especially in the upcoming tourist season.

What is the status of foreign investment in the region?

Due to our strong historical ties with Austria and the fact that many Croats currently work and live in Germany, there is great potential for investment from these countries. The county has a specialized team to help investors make informed investment decisions, as well. We have already received German investments

in the tourism and wind farm sectors and we are poised for more investment from our neighboring countries.

How will the recently opened Pelješac bridge impact Dalmatia?

The Pelješki bridge has played a crucial role in connecting the county, ushering in economic growth and increased tourism. The effects are already visible, with a rise in the number of tourists heading towards Pelješac and Korčula and a surge in real estate prices and investor interest. The bridge's impact has already surpassed expectations around the county since its opening, with more success to come.

How would the projected incoming recession affect the GDP of the region?

As our economy relies heavily on tourism, we are aware of the projected decrease in the gross social product at both the EU and national levels, but we do not anticipate a large impact on our county unless there are significant disruptions to tourism. In fact, 2022 was a remarkably strong year, reaching 87% of the overnight stays compared to 2019, following two difficult years due to the pandemic. While we may share the same fate as others, we expect to be less affected than the average for Croatia or the EU.

What is your final message to Forbes readers?

Dubrovnik-Neretva County is an attractive location for both living and investing, and we warmly welcome you to join us in protecting this precious treasure. With a favorable climate, pristine waters, and beautiful landscapes, we are confident that our region offers an excellent quality of life and abundant investment opportunities. DUBROVNIK AIRPORT DRIVING DALMATIA'S ECONOMY

How much does Dubrovnik Airport contribute to Croatia's economic development?

Dubrovnik Airport is the biggest company in the region with annual revenue of €50 million. It is the main gateway to the Dubrovnik-Neretva and Dalmatia regions with more than 70% of all tourists arriving through Dubrovnik airport.

Can you tell us about the recent expansion project & the improvements made?

The Airport's reconstruction and development project was successful and has decidedly improved traffic connections between the region, the rest of Croatia and the EU. The project consisted of an overhaul of the airport infrastructure to comply with Schengen regulations. This included the reconstruction of the runway and taxiways, terminal building adaptation, waste management facilities, and environmental protection measures. The airport now meets international air traffic standards and is less congested.

What is your strategy for attracting more airlines to Dubrovnik throughout the year?

Dubrovnik Airport has over 60 international destinations during the summer months and is working to secure more partnerships with airlines through an incentive policy and marketing efforts for year-round travel. To attract airlines to Dubrovnik, all regional stakeholders are working together to showcase the region's commitment and viability in sustaining tourism year-round.

Which measures are being implemented to ensure sustainable development?

Dubrovnik Airport has developed an Environmental Strategy for 2021-2027 and is prioritizing sustainability in all of its development projects. Promoting environmental sustainability is a top priority for the airport, with a focus on implementing measures such as solar technology and developing other green programs.

What are the current priorities of the Dubrovnik Airport Board and management ?

We are planning to expand its operations through new routes, partnerships, and initiatives, with a focus on accommodating the growing number of passengers in the next decade. As part of this plan, the airport is considering adding a new terminal and is currently developing a master plan to address this need.

What do you think about Croatia & Dalmatia's business environment in terms of attracting investors & creating high-quality jobs?

Croatia, especially Dalmatia, has a geographic advantage and a growing IT industry with great potential for future business growth. The presence of successful start-ups and unicorn companies are strong evidence that the technology sector here is a promising area for investment and future employment. ●

In addition, sustainability remains at the core of the airport's strategy. Viktor Šober, the CEO of Dubrovnik Airport comments,



Where is the Port now after the COVID pandemic?

We have survived and flourished by making rational decisions and being economically responsible. In 2021 we had around 100,000 passengers and prioritized passenger satisfaction over quantity of arrivals. We anticipate a continued gradual recovery in 2023 and are focusing on improving our passengers' stay and their overall experience.

What progress has the INTER-PASS project made so far?

We have collaborated with the airport on this successful project and plan to continue working together. Our partnership prioritizes enhancing the quality of the guest experience as well as sharing best practices with other ports.

What advancements have you made in the "Respect the City" project?

We are committed to a long-term partnership with the city under the 'Respect the City' initiative. By exchanging stories and finding optimal solutions, we can maintain high-quality stays. Our collaboration with the city has improved the positive perceptions of the cruise guests here and has also helped us manage and optimally coordinate the daily passenger numbers. It is a beneficial investment that continues to make sense for all.

What new projects would you like to discuss?

The Batahovina II project is our top priority and involves creating a new coastline for domestic cruisers and will have a smaller terminal for foreign arrivals.

How important is sustainability and the environment for the Port Authority?

Germans, in particular, have a strong affinity for our region due to our proximity and cultural offerings. While we cannot ignore the inflationary pressures, we remain focused on delivering exceptional experiences that meet the needs and expectations of our valued guests.

How important is attracting high-end tourism to the county

and what are you doing to promote this image in wealthy neighboring countries?

It is no secret that Dubrovnik has become a global brand in its own right, much like Venice. The demand for tourism has continued to grow in recent years, with the challenge now being how to attract high-end tourists to our elite destination. Improvements have been made in areas such as culture, events, historical sights, luxury hotels, and elite restaurants. DUBROVNIK: WHERE CULTURE RULES YEAR ROUND

Dubrovnik has cultivated international recognition as a destination. What are the most important markets for Dubrovnik?

In recent years, the City of Dubrovnik has been most popular among visitors from the UK, US and France. We are actively working to expand the German, Austrian, and Swiss share of the tourist market here, too, especially since the recent opening of the bridge connecting the Dubrovnik area with mainland Croatia. Dubrovnik is closer to these important neighboring countries than ever before by car.

What cultural experiences does Dubrovnik have to offer to German-speaking visitors?

Historically, Austrian culture has had a strong influence on Croatian culture since they were part of the same empire for such a long time.

Both countries share many cultural similarities, including traditions and cuisine. The most prominent examples of Austrian influence in Croatia can be seen in Dubrovnik where many Austrian artists lived and worked. Dubrovnik also hosts concerts and musical guests every year that are of interest to our German-speaking visitors.

How is sustainability prioritized in Dubrovnik?

Sustainable tourism is a key tenet of our city. In recent years, we started a Respect the City initiative that limits the number of visitors in the city at any given time in order to strike a balance between providing a good experience for tourists and maintaining a high quality of life for local residents. This initiative has been remarkably successful and has received international recognition. Additionally, Dubrovnik has a long history of self-sustainability, due to its geographical location on the edge of the world. Our region has not been heavily industrialized, so we have largely preserved its natural beauty, including clean air and water, and picturesque villages. Sustainability has long been integrated into our culture and culinary practices, as well, which visitors can see in events such as the Good Food Festival, held in October.

What does the future hold for Dubrovnik Tourism?

Our mission is to foster high quality, sustainable, year-round tourism. The city has been promoting more events and activities and increasing the number of international flights that take place outside of the peak season. Currently, the main season in Dubrovnik lasts from the end of April to the beginning of November, but the non-peak season can offer visitors a more authentic experience of the city with fewer tourists and cooler weather. Dubrovnik is ready to welcome guests year-round. ●

PORT OF PLOČE: DRIVING REGIONAL GROWTH

Can you summarize the success of the Port of Ploče?

The Port of Ploče benefits from a strategic location, with access to a range of markets through excellent connectivity in all directions, including a newly constructed railway connection through Austria. The port had a highly successful year in 2021, with a non-consolidated profit of 3.7 million euros, and has seen an 80% improvement in performance in 2022, positioning it among the top European ports in terms of operational efficiency.

What are your competitive advantages & challenges compared to other ports in the region?

The strategic location of the port places it at the heart of the European corridor, with five key positions along the way, making it the strategic starting point, which runs through Bosnia and continues into Croatia and Hungary. Its unique ability to accommodate king-size vessels makes it a preferred choice over other ports in the region. In terms of performance, the port's output for 2022 was an impressive

\$5.5 million, reflecting its commitment to continuously improve and deliver results with the highest growth rate in the region.

How are you incentivizing the strategic markets of Germany, Austria, and Switzerland to invest in the Port of Ploče?

The projects are implemented through public-private partnerships (PPPs), with the state responsible for constructing the infrastructure and the private investor responsible for operating the terminal. They attract a mix of local and domestic investors, as well as other investors from the EU. With Croatia joining the Schengen and the Eurozone, it is expected that more will follow, creating a better investment climate.

How does the Port of Ploče ensure compliance with environmental & safety regulations, given the large size & volume of ships that use the port?

The port is committed to complying with both EU and local regulations and aligns all its projects accordingly. Its new projects focus on creating infrastructure that is more connected to renewable energy sources and it is also constructing an independent 5G network. The port has developed its own BCM system to ensure the safe handling of goods and maintain them in their original condition.

What are the short-term goals and plans for the Port?

We have a long-term perspective and prioritize sustainability for the benefit of our shareholders, employees, their families, and future generations. We strive to be environmentally sustainable and self-sufficient, taking care of natural resources and to leave a positive legacy. ●
